Necedah, WI – Following a very successful inaugural disabled hunt in 2008, Wisconsin River Power Company (WRPCO) is hosting its second annual deer hunt for disabled hunters in early October 2009. Up to six (6) permanently disabled hunters will be given the opportunity to hunt, with firearms, on the WRPCO – Petenwell Wildlife Area adjacent to the Petenwell Dam in Central Wisconsin on October 9, 10, & 11, 2009. The Wildlife Area is approximately 750 acres and has been set aside by WRPCO as a wildlife refuge. The majority of the area is closed to other hunting activities.

WRPCO employees have built hunting stands for the disabled hunters. Volunteers will provide transportation to and from the stands and serve as hunting partners, if needed.

Hunting will take place Friday afternoon, Saturday morning and afternoon, and Sunday morning. WRPCO will provide meals for hunt participants and guests Friday evening, Saturday morning (following the morning hunt) and mid-day, and Sunday morning after the final morning hunt.

Hunters are responsible for transportation to and from the hunting area near Necedah in Central Wisconsin, their lodging, remaining weekend meals, personal equipment, and hunting license. All hunters must obtain a State of Wisconsin Class A disabled permit prior to the hunt.
